## How to get there

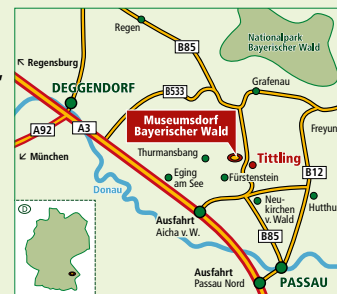
Motorway A3 "Regensburg - Passau", leave it at "Aicha v. W." and follow the signs:

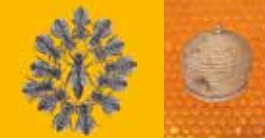

**Of bees and bee-keepers (Building No 59)**  
Traditional bee hives and bee-keeping in the Bavarian Forest



**Central European tobacco pipes of the 18th and 19th century (Building No 1)**



**Exhibition for children "Now and then" (Building No 110)**  
An exhibition especially for children shows the contrasts between now and then. It deals with farming, school and family as seen by the rural population 100 years ago.



**Germany's oldest schoolhouse (Building No 9)**  
The house was built between 1666 and 1670 and was also a town hall and a prison.  
**Picture exhibition**  
Grimm anniversary: pictures of fairy tales - eye-catchers in the classroom



**Vintage cars and other vehicles (Building No 140)**  
Lanz tractors (year of manufacture 1921), 3 vintage cars of the 1920s and the first Rotel Tours bus (1945)

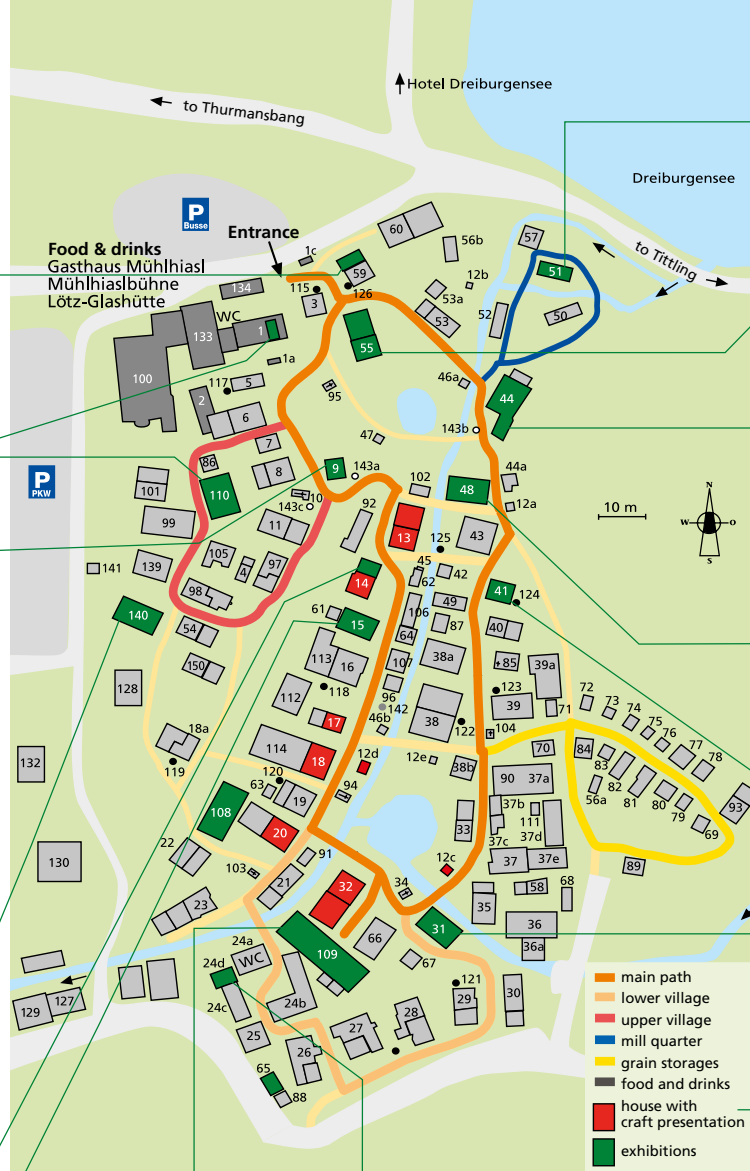


**Textile printing (Building No 14)**  
The exhibition shows old woodblocks for printing and the various techniques. There is also a traditional blueprint workshop with its old equipment.



**"Something is going on in the living room" (Building No 15)** Exhibition with many exceptional things

- Prams, cradles, rocking horses
- Tin soldiers, marionettes, toys
- Birdcages and mousetraps



**Transportation in former times (Building No 109)**  
A variety of the most interesting old carts, carriages and sledges



**New: Culture of beer and saloons in Lower Bavaria (Building 24d)**  
In the old brewery a video shows how beer was brewed there.



**Old hammer forge (Building No 51)**



**Exhibition farm (Building No 55)**

- Combs and decorations for horses
- Popular glass of the Bavarian Forest
- Pocket watches and other nice things to have



**Religious artefacts (Building No 44 – Rothau mill)**

- 106 display cases with a comprehensive collection:
- religious folk art of the 18th/19th century
  - religious folk life in the Bavarian Forest
  - pictures painted on the back of glass



**New: Culture of beer and saloons in Lower Bavaria (Building 48)**

The anniversary of the Bavarian Beer Purity Law (500 years: 1516 – 2016) is the reason for this exhibition



**Wheel maker (Building No 41)**

Workshop of a wheel maker with equipment of the 19th and early 20th century

**Pottery in Lower Bavaria (Building No 31)**

Pottery from Kröning near Landshut, Peterskirchen near Eggenfelden, Oberzell etc.



**Many animals live in our village**

Our tame donkey shares its enclosure with sheep and goats. Hens and cats also belong to our village. From June on there are also geese.
